

ENDING POWER OF ATTORNEY OVER A MINOR

YOU CAN USE THIS PACKET IF ALL THIS IS TRUE:

- You gave another person power of attorney over your child.
- You want to cancel that power before the expiration date listed on the Power of Attorney.

Before signing a court document or getting involved with a court case, it's important to see an attorney to make sure you understand your legal rights and responsibilities. The Self-Help Center has information on finding an attorney.

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: FILL OUT THE REVOCATION OF POWER OF ATTORNEY OVER A MINOR CHILD

- (1) Enter your name.
- (2) Enter the name and birthdate of each child included in the Power of Attorney.
- (3) Enter the date when the Power of Attorney began.
- (4) Enter the name of the person with power of attorney.
- (5) Date and sign.

STEP 2: DELIVER THE REVOCATION OF POWER OF ATTORNEY TO THE PERSON WITH POWER OF ATTORNEY

Keep a copy for your records. The revocation is effective when you deliver it.
