

Free Deterra Available

Deterra is a drug deactivation system that neutralizes drugs effectively, safely, and quickly.

How to use:

- Place unused medications in pouch.
- Fill halfway with warm tap water and wait 30 seconds.
- Seal and gently shake pouch. Dispose with normal trash.

Deterra is available for FREE at the CCPHSD Clinic Office, Health and Community Services Building, 2625 N. King Street, Flagstaff, Monday-Friday, 8:00 am-5:00 pm.

Prescription Drug Overdose Prevention Program

The Coconino County Public Health Services District Prescription Drug Overdose Prevention Program is part of a statewide initiative to reduce the number of fatal opioid overdoses in Coconino County. The Program implements five public health strategies from the Arizona Rx Misuse and Abuse Toolkit.

STRATEGY 1 - Reduce Illicit acquisition and diversion of prescription drugs

STRATEGY 2 - Promote responsible prescribing and dispensing policies and practices

STRATEGY 3 - Enhance Rx drug practices and policies in law enforcement

STRATEGY 4 - Increase public awareness and patient education about Rx drug misuse and abuse

STRATEGY 5 - Enhance assessment and referral to substance abuse treatment

In addition, program staff are working with agencies throughout Coconino County to build partnerships and create awareness of resources pertaining to opioid use.

Free naloxone distribution program

WHAT IS NALOXONE?

Naloxone is an easy-to-use, lifesaving medication that can reverse the effects of overdose from heroin or other opioids, including morphine, methadone, codeine, and other drugs derived from the poppy plant.

WHO CAN RECEIVE FREE NALOXONE?

Naloxone can be distributed to those who use opioids or have family and friends that use opioids.

WHAT WILL COMMUNITY MEMBERS RECEIVE?

Community members will receive overdose response education & training prior to receiving free naloxone kits.
