



# Feedback from community members on the health of Coconino County

April 18, 2019

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## Introduction

Coconino County Public Health Service District (CCPHSD) reached out to community members across the county in order to find out more about how they feel about their health and the health of their community. Participants were asked about the CCPHSD 2013 Community Health Assessment (CHA), what health-related topics impacted them most, and for insight on how improvements can be made to share information on health of the county.

## What is the population like that took the survey?

The CCPHSD 2013 CHA Community Feedback survey was opened from January 7, 2019 until February 25, 2019. In that time frame, 205 surveys were initiated; 164 (80%) were completed. The following sections describe response of survey participants. Please note: the total responses to each question will vary depending on the survey's completion level, and qualitative responses are quoted directly from the survey report. A copy of this survey can be viewed in Appendix A.

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### *Where are you taking this survey?*

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Almost half (46.4%) of the survey participants took the CCPHSD 2013 CHA Feedback survey through a link emailed to them. The next largest group (38.1%) did not fall into the original location categories; most of these took the survey through a link posted on Facebook or at an event where a staff member or intern was present.

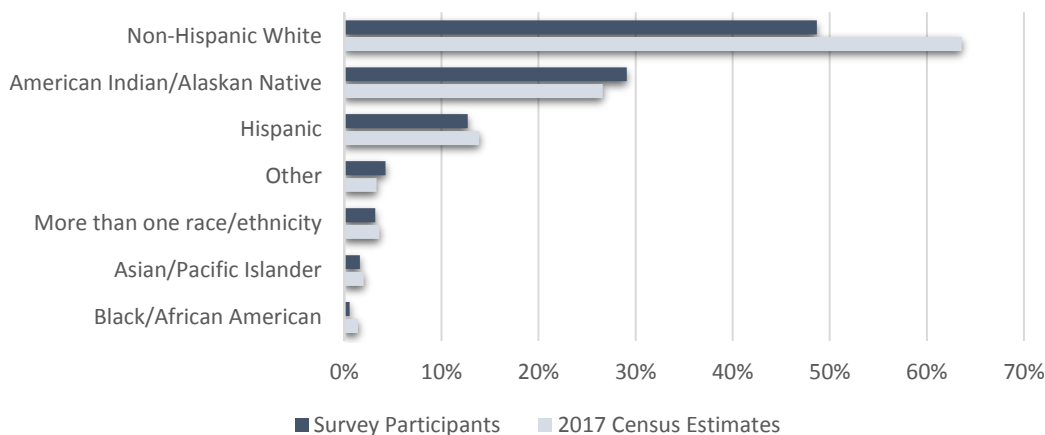

### What is your race/ethnicity?

Of those that provided their race/ethnicity, 92 (48.68%) responded as Non-Hispanic White, 55 (29.1%) responded as American Indian/Alaska native, 24 (12.7%) responded as Hispanic, 8 (4.32%) responded as Other, 6 (3.17%) responded as more than one race/ethnicity, 3 (1.59%) responded as Asian Pacific Islander, and 1 (0.53%) responded as Black/African American. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates that the percent of each race/ethnicity category for 2017 in Coconino County to be fairly comparable, showing that the polled population has similar demographics.<sup>1</sup>



### What gender do you identify as?

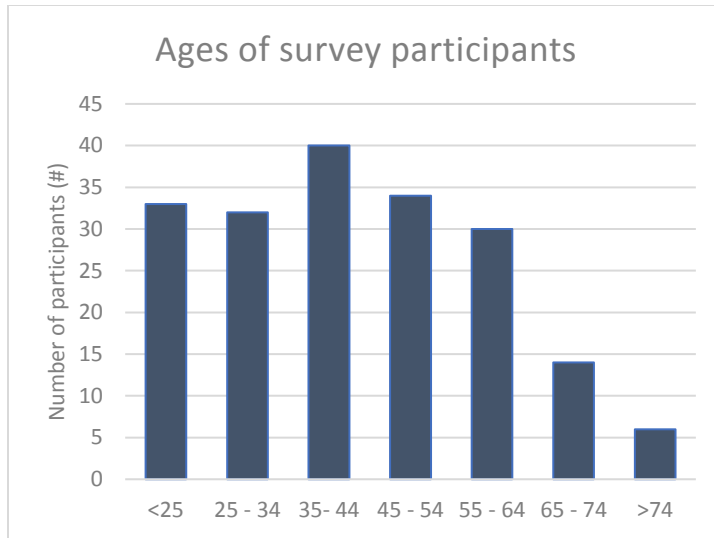
The majority of survey takers responded as being female (72%), 52 (27.5%) responded as being male, and one (0.52%) participant responded as being transgender. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the gender distribution in Coconino County in 2017 is estimated to be 49.2% Male and 50.8% Female (this source does not include Transgender as an option),<sup>1</sup> therefore the surveyed populations was slightly disproportionate.

### What is your age?

All age groups were represented, and the distribution of within age groups was fairly comparable. Of the 189 participants that selected their age group, 40 (21.2%) were between 35-44 years, 34 (18.0%) were between 45-54 years, 33 (17.5%) were younger than 25 years, 32 (16.9%) were between 25-34 years, 30 (15.9%) were between 55-64 years, 14 (7.4%) were between 65-74, and 6 (3.2%) were over the age of 74.

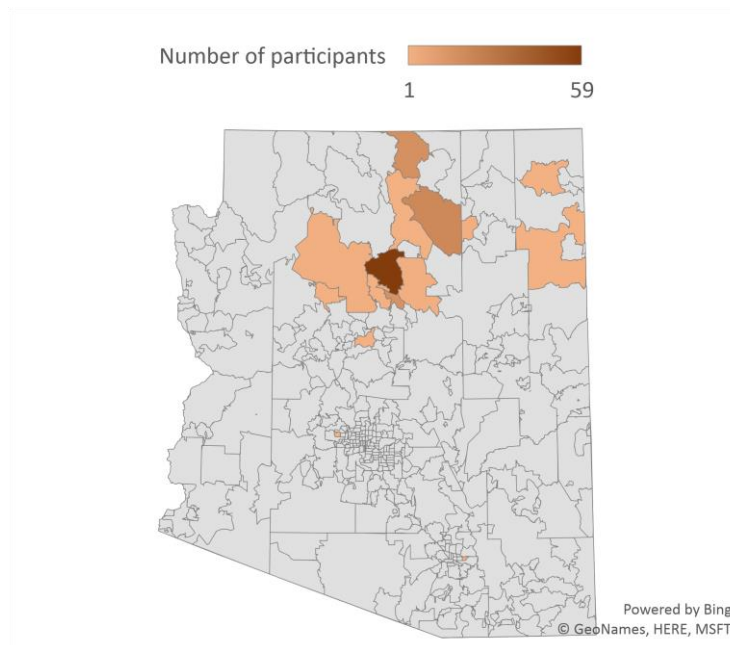

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*What is the zip code of your primary residence?*

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Zip codes provided were primarily across northern Arizona, however there were a few out of state. Several of the zip codes given are outside of Coconino County, however this represents the outreach that our services provide. The map below shows the density of the residence location of survey participants. Participants who report their primary residence is in Flagstaff made up 62.4% of responses.

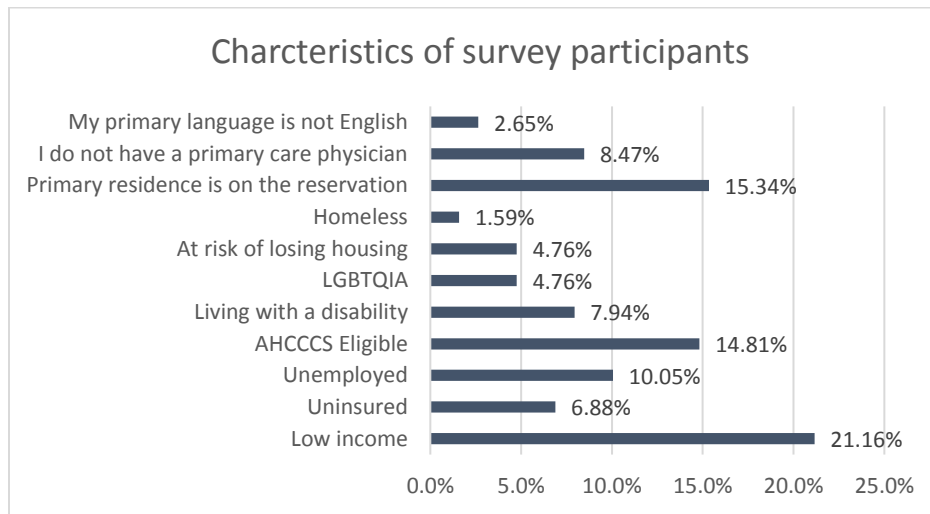

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*Which of the following categories describe you?*

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To ensure the input was received from populations that need services the most, participants were asked to choose various categories that describe themselves. The most common category selected was *Low income* (21.2%), followed by *Primary residence is on the reservation* (15.3%), *AHCCCS eligible* (14.8%), and *Unemployed* (6.9%). There were 3 participants (1.59%) who describe themselves as being *Homeless*. Those who are described as *LGBTQIA*, *Living with a disability*, *Uninsured*, and whose primary language is not English are represented in this population. 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### Have you heard of/read the CCPHSD 2013 CHA?

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When asked if survey participants had heard of the CCPHSD 2013 CHA and if they had read the report, the majority (61.7%) reported they hadn't previously heard of the report and only 34 (18.1%) of participants had previously read the report.

The survey participants that responded *No* to reading the CCPHSD 2013 CHA were asked their reasons why they had not. Over 83% reported that they never heard of the report. Explanations for *Other* reasons are listed below.

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### Participants were offered the CCPHSD 2013 survey to review

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Of the 152 participants that reported they had not/weren't sure if they had read the CCPHSD 2013 CHA, 39 (25.7%) chose to read the document at that time. This increased more than twofold the number of participants who had read the CCPHSD 2013 CHA from 34 to 73 of the survey participants (38.8%).



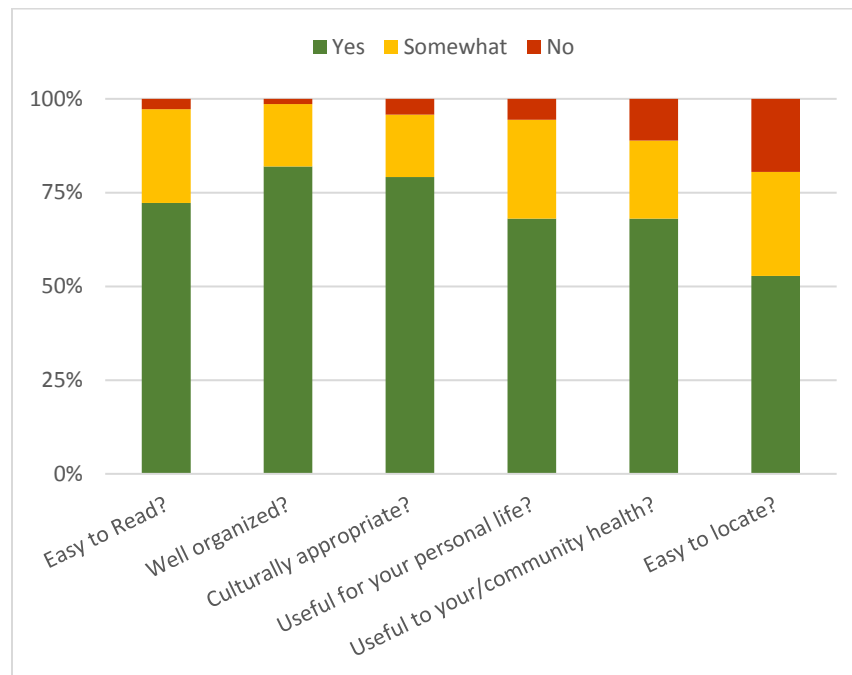
## What did they say about the 2013 report?

This portion of the CCPHSD 2013 CHA Community Feedback survey asks questions regarding the report itself. As previously stated, 73 (38.8%) of the survey participants read the report and could contribute.

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### *Was the CCPHSD 2013 CHA...*

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Of those who had read the CCPHSD 2013 CHA, 81.9% described it as well organized, 79% reported it as culturally appropriate, and 72.2% said it was easy to read. Over 68% described the report as useful to their personal life as well as useful to identify new ways to improve their health/the health of their community. Only about half of participants say that the CCPHSD 2013 CHA was easy to locate.

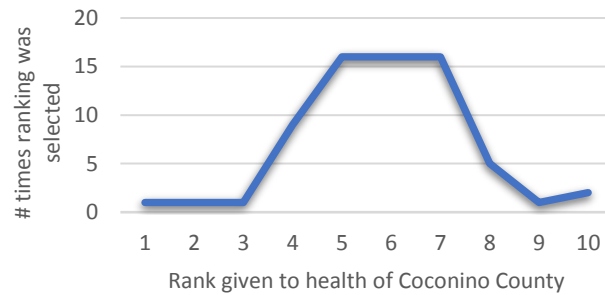

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### How would you rate the health of Coconino County?

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The survey participants rated the health of Coconino County after reading the CCPHSD 2013 CHA on a scale of 0 (being low) to 10 (being high). The average health rating was 5.87, the median health rating was 6, and the most commonly selected health rating was 7.




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### Questions regarding the sections of the assessment

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Survey participants chose which sections of the CCPHSD 2013 CHA 1) they found most interesting, 2) that meant the most to them, and 3) that meant the most to their community. Below are the number of participants that responded to the questions with each section; the darker the shade, the more participants that selected that section. When asked which section was most interesting to them, participants responded *Mortality rates and cause of death* most. When asked which section meant the most to them, participants responded *Health resources* most. When asked which section meant the most to their community, participants responded *Community concerns* most.

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*Does the CCPHSD 2013 CHA address all populations in Coconino County?*

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Of those who responded when asked if the assessment addresses all populations in Coconino County, 54 (84.4%) of participants selected *Yes*. Those who *No* (15.63%) suggested that there could be more representation of certain groups.

Responses for *No*, please explain:

- Definitely a challenge to make sure that all members of the community are represented...
- Oral health needs
- The LGBTQIA population could be represented
- Too much yes or no. Income compared to the rest of Arizona (where housing is much less expensive) is not relevant. The wage for Clerking in Pima County is 1 or 2 % less than here but the housing is 100% or more, more expensive here.
- Unintentional deaths = tourists doing stupid things and dying.
- Were all age populations included?
- Yes, and yet it doesn't contextualize and explicitly name social determinants of health or disparate risk and impact on certain populations.

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*What section would you like to learn more about?*

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Survey participants chose which sections of the CCPHSD 2013 CHA were interested in learning more about. Below are the number of participants that responded to the question with each section; the darker the shade, the more participants that selected that section. Participants responded *Health Resources* most, followed by *Community concerns* and *Environmental factors*.

An option for participants was to select *Other* with an explanation. Those responses are as follows:

- Cost of living in Coconino County and how that compares to average income in Coconino County compared to the rest of AZ
- Displays by GPS mapping
- Effect language barriers have on healthcare literacy
- Explain why sexually transmitted infections continue to increase despite your efforts.
- Housing, Employment
- How racism and discrimination affect health.
- Income and housing. Income cannot be compared to the rest of Arizona as housing is 100% higher than the areas being compared. Either wages need to go up or housing needs to be developed for those making less than 40k per year.
- Mental Health resiliency
- More info on positives things/data that is occurring
- More social determinants
- None of the above
- Oral health
- Poverty; youth isolation
- Suicide

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*Is there a health-related issue not discussed in the CPHSD 2013 CHA that should have been included?*

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About one quarter of survey participants that responded (25.4%) said there no missing health-related issues, however almost three-quarters stated there were issues missing.

*Yes, please explain* responses:

- ACES; opioid drug use
- Broader look at social determinants
- Cost of living
- Cost of living in Coconino compared to AZ and effect on poverty
- Did not see a lot of info related to youth
- Housing for those making less than 40k - many of whom work for the County.

## Questions on health-related topics for Coconino County

This portion of the CCPHSD 2013 CHA Community Feedback survey asks questions to all survey participants on health-related topics in general, separate from the CCPHSD 2013 CHA. These responses will provide suggestions for the upcoming Community Health Assessment of Coconino County.

*Rank these health-related topics from most important (1) to least important (11) to your community*

Survey participants were asked to rank 10 health-related topics with the option of an eleventh fill-in-the-blank topic of their choosing. The raw data was sorted by most commonly chosen responses for each of the eleven slots. Secondly, all responses were assigned scores based on the selected position, scores of these were averaged, and then arranged based on scores. To minimize the influence of responses submitted where no change was made to the order, these were removed (13 responses, 7.9%). This process was performed again on the non-sequential responses. The table below displays the culminating ranks.

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*What method would be the best way for you to receive information about a Community Health Assessment?*

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In order to more efficiently reach the residents of Coconino County, survey participants were asked how they preferred to receive information in the future. Most responded that they preferred the information to be shared on the CCPHSD website (40.2%), followed by Facebook (38.4%) and by Mailer (32.9%). 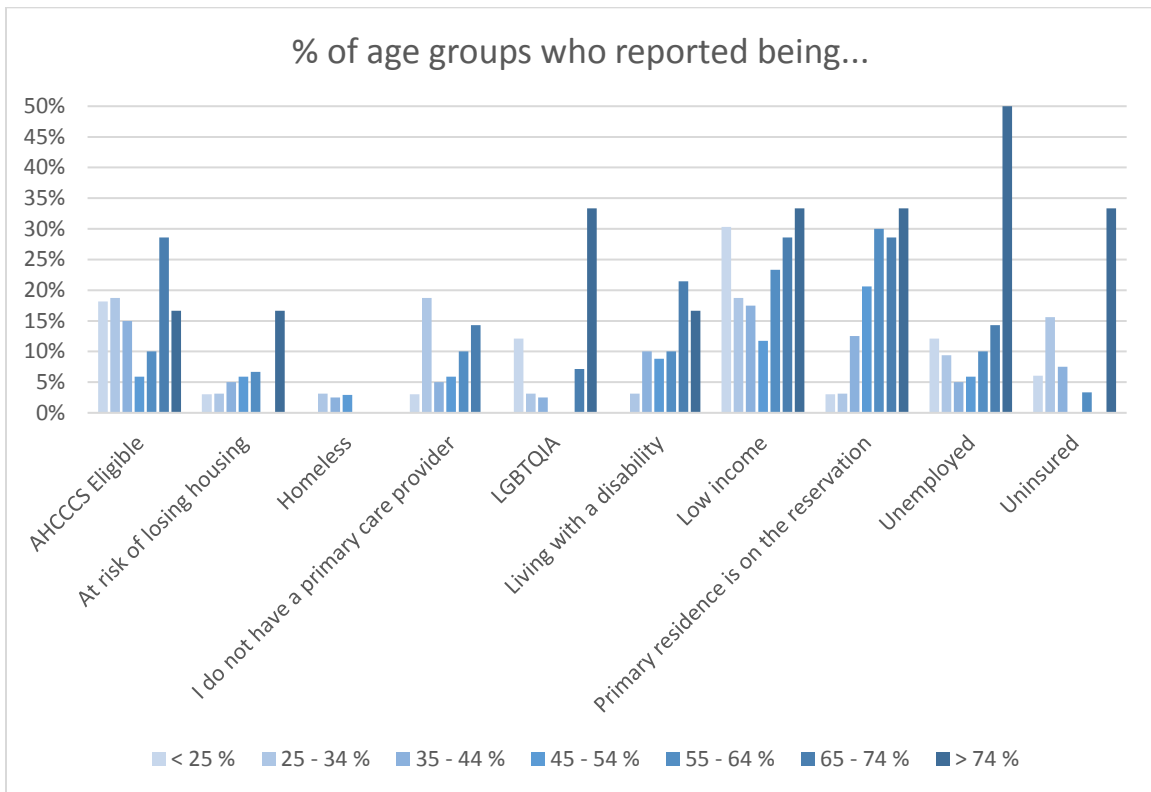
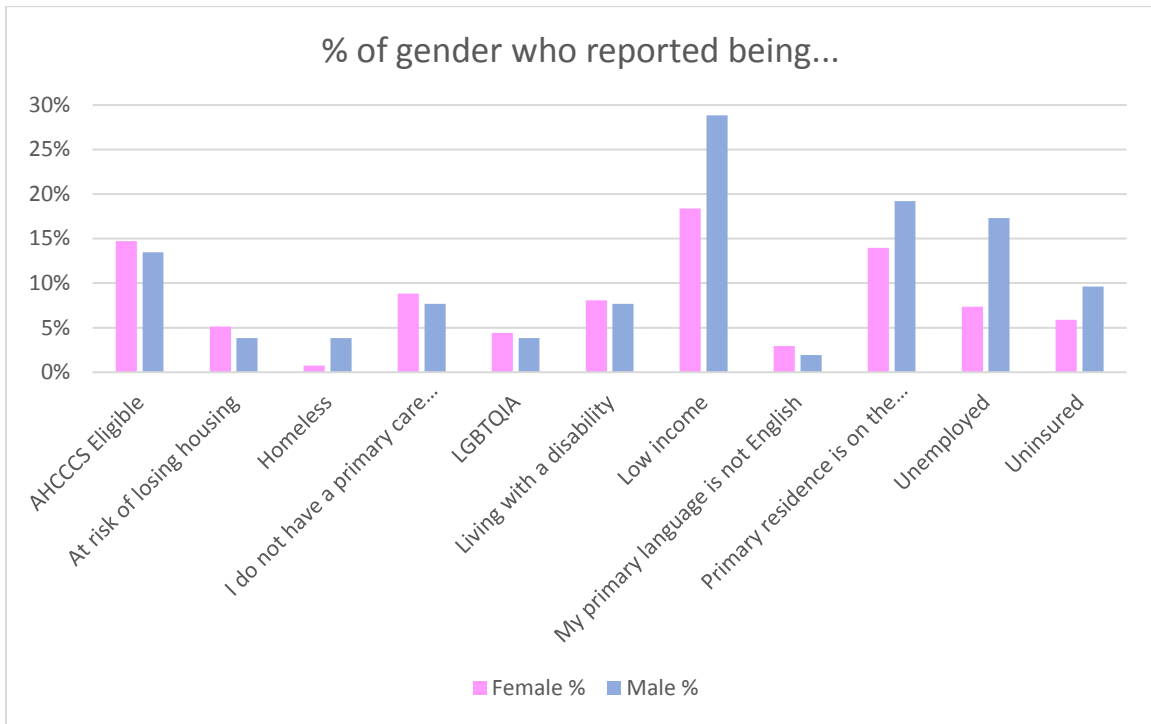
