

Coconino County Parks and Recreation's (CCPR) event re-opening plan includes fluidity in order to execute the plan with the safety and health of staff, partners and the public as the backbone principles. CCPR will continue to monitor and deploy protocols that align with Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), and Coconino County Health and Human Services (CCHHS) guidelines for public gatherings. The re-opening phases noted below shall be implemented based on directives received through Governor Executive Orders, County Board of Supervisors and County Management.

### Considerations for Re-opening Events

- Governor Ducey Executive Orders and directives.
- CDC Public health control activities by level of COVID-19 community transmission.
  - **None to Minimal** - Evidence of isolated cases or limited community transmission, case investigations underway, no evidence of exposure in large communal setting, e.g., healthcare facility, school, mass gathering
  - **Minimal to Moderate** - Widespread and/or sustained transmission with high likelihood or confirmed exposure within communal settings with potential for rapid increase in suspect cases.
  - **Substantial** - Large scale community transmission, healthcare staffing significantly impacted, multiple cases within communal settings like healthcare facilities, schools, mass gatherings etc.
- Cases may vary from day to day, thus weekly comparisons will be utilized as they offer greater consistency.
- County Health and Human Services Department's determination of transmission levels are based on investigations demonstrating that transmission is or is not occurring in communal settings.
- Transmission levels may vary between communities, and events will be evaluated and approved accordingly.
- Events will be consistently evaluated and approved based on their unique scope and variables.
- CDC, ADHS and CCHHS recommendations and guidelines for events and mass gatherings will be utilized.
- Event's ability to deploy COVID-19 prevention measures.
- Staff's ability to safely clean and disinfect rented facilities after an event.
- Fort Tuthill County Park Commercial Building being an active COVID-19 testing site. Event rentals may not occupy Commercial Building or impact traffic ingress and egress of testing site.

- Direction from Coconino County Board of Supervisors, County Managers Office and Health and Human Services Department.

### **Phasing Trajectory Criteria, Tracking and Communication Plan**

- Staff will monitor the COVID-19 Data Dashboard's *Weekly COVID -19 Cases by Geographic Region* Graph which is posted on the County website and updated every Wednesday by 10 a.m.
- When the same upward or downward trend occurs over a two-week period, CCPR staff will verify changes in community level transmission phases with CCHHS.
- For events scheduled within two weeks of an upward two-week trend in COVID-19 cases, CCPR will consult with event producers, CCHHS and County Management on appropriate modifications, postponement or cancellation of said events.
- CCPR will send weekly emails to event producers with updated information on status of two-week trends and other relevant information.

### **Special Event Phased Re-opening**

#### **Phase One: Substantial Levels of COVID-19 Transmission**

- No events or gatherings are permitted.

#### **Phase Two: Minimal to Moderate Levels of COVID-19 Transmission**

- Events no larger than 250.
- Events will demonstrate the ability to limit the congregation of groups of 10 or more in relation to the space being rented (per Governor Ducey Executive Order).
- Event producers will be asked to sign an amendment to their permits.
- Events would be required to submit and implement a detailed Public Health Precautions plan including protocols as described below.
- Events will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

#### **Phase Three: None to Minimal Levels of COVID-19 Transmission**

- Events larger than 250.
- Event producers will be asked to sign an amendment to their permits.
- Events would be required to submit and implement a detailed Public Health Precautions plan including protocols as described below.
- Events will be evaluated on a case by case basis.

## **Phase Four: Availability of COVID-19 Vaccine**

- When a FDA tested and approved COVID-19 vaccine becomes available to all willing to be vaccinated, events operations will return to pre-COVID-19 conditions.

## **Event COVID-19 Precautionary Guidelines**

All events, regardless of size, will be required to submit a Public Health Precautions plan addressing the following as appropriate. Not all guidelines will apply to all events. Public health protocols will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

- Participant 6-foot, physical distancing i.e. 6-foot markings, distancing at lines, entrances, concessions, event participants, spectator areas
- Plan to limit in-person contact, for example cash handling, points of sale, sign-in areas, registrations, bag checks
- Transmission barriers, removing communal items, encouraging touchless pay
- Restroom cleaning and disinfecting protocols, and for larger events a restroom attendant is recommended
- Surface cleaning and disinfecting
- Hand washing and/or a minimum of 60% alcohol hand sanitizer station locations and amounts
- COVID-19 precautions signage plan to include hygiene practices, physical distancing, feeling ill, etc.
- COVID-19 precaution enforcement plan
- Pre-event communication plan asking participants to take safety measures i.e. wearing masks, carrying hand sanitizer
- PPE for event goers i.e. masks
- Event staff, volunteers, vendors, entertainment, etc. PPE plan
- Event staff, volunteers, vendors, entertainment, etc. symptom screening
- Plan for screening measures and action plan for suspected positives
- Operation Plan for suspected COVID-19 carrier at event
- Additional information may be requested by CCHHS or CCPR to ensure public safety

Events or event activities will not be permitted in proximity of the Fort Tuthill COVID-19 Testing Site.

Per permit addendum, Coconino County will retain the right to ask for modifications, postponement or cancellation of an event should COVID-19 public health conditions change.
