Voting in Coconino County— Safe, secure, trusted, transparent

Steps we take to ensure your vote counts:

SAFETY AND SECURITY is designed into every step, from voter registration, early voting and election day boards to tabulation and final canvassing of results.

EVERY FUNCTION and responsibility separated and protected by layers of checks and balances, including live-camera streaming of bi-partisan counting boards.

PHYSICAL SAFEGUARDS that control access to equipment and/or ballots also detect tampering or malicious activity.

PROTECTIONS include elections personnel background checks, building keypad access, 24-7 closed-circuit camera systems, and chains of custody seals and locks.

AIR-GAP SYSTEM protects state-of-the-art voting and tabulation equipment without Internet access to eliminate data/equipment hacking.

BALLOTS ARE REGULARLY RETRIEVED from secured drop boxes by at least two people of opposite political parties, with Logs and Seals audited and retained.

EQUIPMENT ACCURACY AND INTEGRITY is guaranteed through independent testing and certification by the Arizona Secretary of State prior to state/federal elections and by testing before, during, and after every election by Republican and Democratic Party representatives.

QUALIFIED, CERTIFIED STAFF verify each mailed or dropped-off ballot signature against the voter registration file to guarantee only legitimate votes.

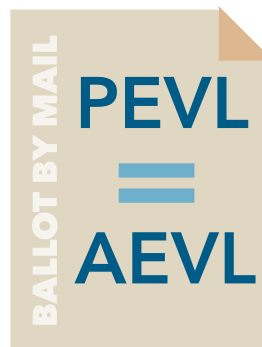

New In 2022

Due to a recent change in state law, the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL) is now called the Active Early Voting List (AEVL). If you were already on the PEVL, you will now be listed as an Active Early Voter and will continue to receive early ballots by mail.



If you are listed as an Active Early Voter, you will automatically receive a ballot by mail approximately three weeks before each election in which you are eligible to vote. If you wish to be removed from the Active Early Voter List, or to cancel mailing of early ballots for one or more elections, please contact the Recorder's Office.

If you are NOT an Active Early Voter, you will receive a sample ballot before each election notifying you where you may vote for that election.

You must update your voter registration whenever you change your residence address, name, or political party preference.

Election mail is not forwardable. It is important to keep your mailing address current with our office, even if you are only temporarily away.

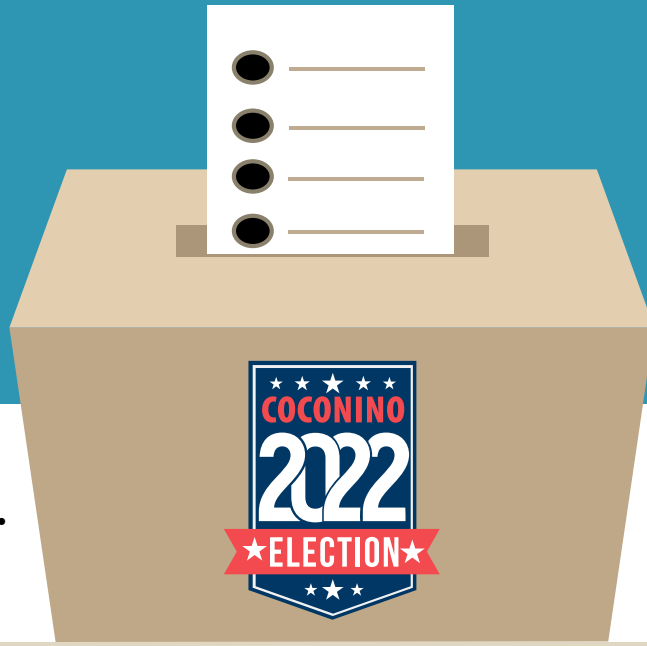

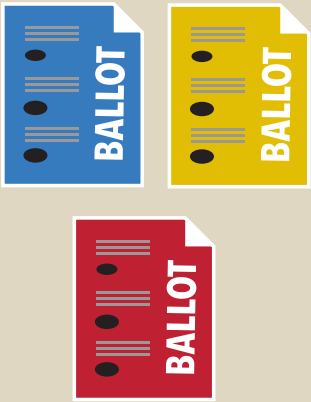

All registered voters are eligible to vote in the state Primary Election.

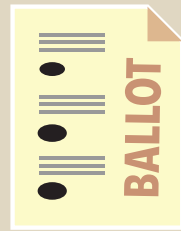
Voters registered with a recognized political party may only vote that party's ballot.

- DEMOCRATIC
 - LIBERTARIAN
 - REPUBLICAN
- YOU VOTE YOUR PARTY'S BALLOT**



Voters who are not registered with a recognized political party, including those registered as Independent, may choose one party ballot to vote.

- UNAFFILIATED VOTERS MAY CHOOSE A DEMOCRATIC OR REPUBLICAN BALLOT



Voters who are on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) and are not registered with a recognized political party must let the Recorder's Office know which ballot they want to receive.

If a ballot is not specified, then one will not be mailed.

The easiest way to choose a ballot is to return the white form mailed to you in May.

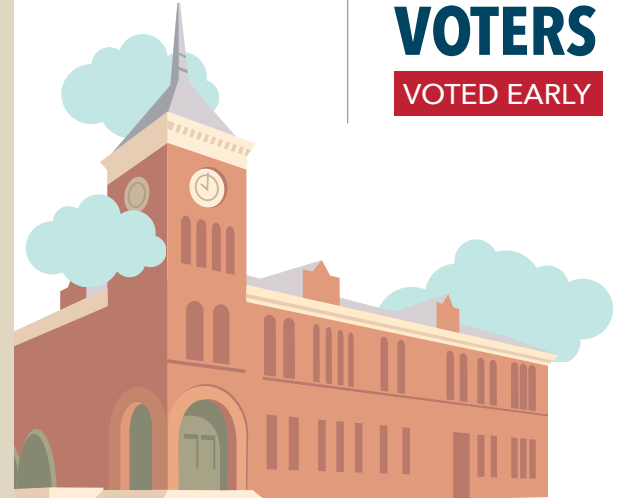

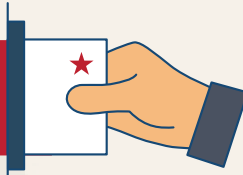

Active Early Voting List (AEVL)

Any registered voter with a mailing address within Arizona may request to be placed on the Active Early Voter List (AEVL). **Voters on the AEVL will automatically receive an early ballot by mail for all elections in which they are eligible to participate.**

There is an option to sign up for the AEVL on the Arizona voter registration form.

Request an Early Ballot

Voters who are not on the Active Early Voting List may request an early ballot to be mailed to them up to 11 days before an election.

An early ballot can be requested through our website, by phone, or in writing.

Vote Early In Person

Voters may vote early in person up until the Friday before an election.

Early voting is available at the Coconino County Recorder's Office as well as several other sites within the county. Please call for more information or visit our website for a complete list of early voting sites.
